

HYBRID MEETINGS AND OTHER USES OF TECHNOLOGY


Are you interested in learning more about hybrid meetings and other uses of technology within the u3a movement? If you are there is a wealth of information available online on a number of websites within the u3a movement.(follow the highlighted links).

Start by going to the National u3a YouTube channel; <u>u3a YouTube Channel</u> Under the <u>Playlists</u> tab is a playlist called 'Running your u3a'. There are 8 videos listed in the playlist, the last being: <u>Alternative Ways of Meeting</u> - <u>Hybrid and Other Options</u> This is a half hour video prepared and presented by Liz Thackray.

At the end of Liz Thackray's video is a recommendation to go to Exmouth & District u3a's Connect & Learn website: Connect and Learn where there is much additional information. One of the tabs is on video calls: connect and learn / videocalls where the second link down is to a section on 'How to hold hybrid (or twinned) meetings using Zoom'.

Last but by no means least is the London Region Sharing webpage: <u>London Region - Sharing</u> Towards the bottom of the list of Shared Practice Guides is a 41 page document on Hybrid Meetings <u>Shared Practice</u> <u>Guide -Alterative Ways of Meeting</u> This is a comprehensive guide with all the technical aspects clearly explained. Liz's video and this guide are an excellent combination.
